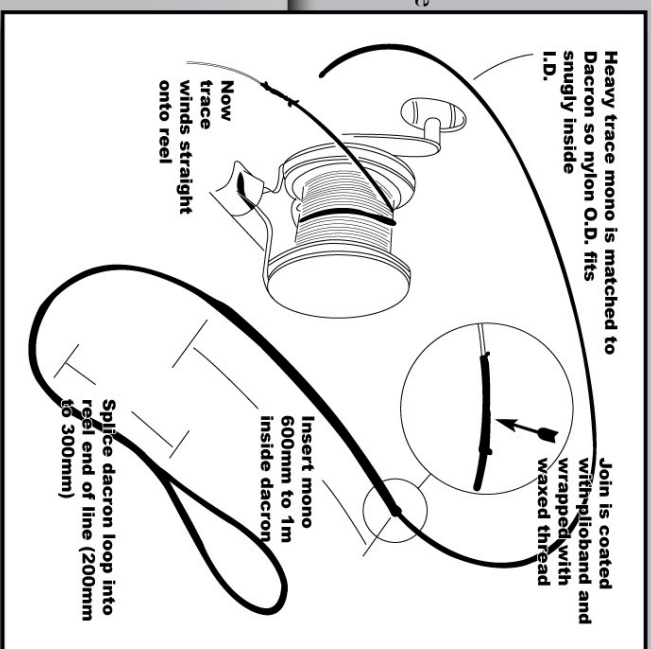

# WIND ON LEADER

On most gamefishing boats, ball bearing swivels and snaps are used to connect the main line to the trace. The idea was common in sportfishing circles, mostly achieved by joining the main line and trace with a slender knot, such as an Albright Special or similar, or a Dacron sleeving joint. This enable the trace to be wound right onto the reel, giving the angler all the holding power of the heavier line and enabling him to either gaff his own fish or at least be involved in the catching process right up to the gaff shot.

The Dacron sleeving method is neater and better for winding onto a reel than any knot system. A typical 36kg rig would be around 3m of double and the same of 200lb planer board Dacron and 500lb Jinkai, giving you just under 30ft in total. This falls well within the overall IGFA regulations of total trace length of 40ft (12.2m).

The Dacron is spliced back into itself for about 600mm to form a connecting loop, which is joined loop to loop with the doubled main line or with a Cats Paw knot. The end of the Dacron splice is then secured by wrapping it with waxed thread and encasing the splice in Pliobond. At the other end, the Jinkai is inserted into the hollow Dacron with a natty set of Australian-designed needles. As with the splice, the ends of the Dacron are bound with waxed thread and Pliobond used to ensure the join.
